## **CORBIS FOR SOCIAL JUSTICE**

Visual media provider Corbis, in conjunction with the Art Directors Club of New York, has announced the winner of its second annual Corbis Creativity for Social Justice awards and scholarship. The awards were set up to acknowledge the design work completed by both professionals and students on a pro-bono basis for not-for-profit organisations. The winner of the professional category receives a cash prize of \$20,000, which is donated to their cause while the student winner receives a \$5000 scholarship to encourage them to continue their good works. This year in the professional category two winners were chosen, Taxi Canada for its 15 Below Project and Vitruvio Leo Burnett Spain for its work with the Prodis Foundation. James Yang of the New York-based School of Visual Arts took out the scholarship for his work on the Darfur Genocide Campaign.
